**SAFETY ON THE ROAD**  
 The road along the eastern side of the island is heavily patrolled by police, park rangers, & the government's free roadside assistance patrol, "The Green Angels." Do not hesitate to flag down one of these public servants for assistance. They are here to help and they will be happy to do so. To call a Green Angel dial **078**. For other emergencies dial **911**

**TRAFFIC LAWS**  
 The speed limit on the coastal C-1 road is 40-70 KM/H, or 24-44 MHP. No more than two people may ride on a two-wheeled vehicle at one time. Right turns on red after stopping are allowed.

**TRAFFIC VIOLATIONS**  
 If you are stopped for a moving violation, the police officer is not authorized to settle the fine on the spot. He will confiscate your drivers' license, take it to the police station, and request that you go to the station to resolve the infraction and retrieve your license. At the station, you can plead your case or pay the fine.
